

TRANSGENDER

GENDER | PART OF THE GAYTHER PRIDE IN SERIES



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(pronounced - **tranz-jen-duh** | **trænz 'dʒɛndə**)

A transgender individual identifies with a gender or sex which is different from the one they were assigned at birth. Transgender people are physically one gender; however, they know that they belong to the opposite sex, effectively a man trapped in a woman's body or vice versa. Transgender individuals will often undergo transitioning surgery to change their appearance and anatomy to ultimately change their outward appearance to reflect their true inner self. Trans or Transgender is an umbrella term for the process of transition, with the word transexual typically used with a person who has undergone reassignment surgery or hormone replacement therapy. It is important to note that transgender people will define their gender as male or female rather than trans. FTM or AFAB are abbreviations for a female or assigned female at birth. Alternatively, MTF or AMAB are abbreviations for a male or assigned male at birth.

SUMMARY

- Trans* or Trans+ (pronounced - tranz-as-tuh-risk or pluhs | trænz 'æs tə rɪsk or plʌs) are two umbrella terms that refer to the range of identities inside and outside of the gender spectrum

TAKE PRIDE

Acceptance and coming to terms with how a person chooses to identify or love, especially in accepting it themselves, is often challenging. Self-discovery is typically one of the most significant steps a person from the LGBTQIA+ community can take. The acceptance process can be complex and made worse when we can not associate, connect or identify with others similar to ourselves. Failing to find a positive representative can make a person feel disconnected, isolated and alone.

INTERESTING STATISTICS

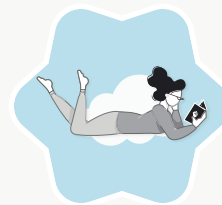
- It is believed that less than 0.3% of the world's population identify as transgender
- Transgender history dates as far back as the 3rd millennium BC, where transgender Gala priests were mentioned in Sumerian and Akkadian texts
- The Roman emperor Elagabalus who died in 222AD is considered one of the earliest recorded transgender individuals
- 98 or 42% of all countries around the world have some form of laws in place relating to gender identity or expression
- Bangladesh and India are the only two countries around the world that have a third gender option, known as hijra, besides male and female is available
