

The Golden Wattle, or Acacia Pycnantha, is a tree native to south eastern Australia. The tree has been on the continent of Australia for over 35 million years. It is a highly resilient tree, resilient to drought, wind and bushfires. The tree has played an integral part in the history of Australia's indigenous population, with the tree used as food, medicines, weapons, tools, perfumes and many more uses.
