The Heather, or Ericaceae, is a family of flowering plants. The plant has over 4000 known species and can be found across Europe and those countries neighbouring the Mediterranean Sea. The plant usually blooms from July to November, and birds and the wind help to disperse its seeds. The name originates from the Greek word kallune, which means to clean or brush. Historically, the name was given as heather was used to make brooms, and the plants symbolise admiration and good luck. **NATIONAL FLOWER:** The Heather is the national flower of Norway
