Represents remembrance and resistance (a reclaimed symbol of oppression)

One of the most significant historical symbols associated with the LGBTQIA+ community, the pink triangle was used during the Nazi era to identify men imprisoned for homosexuality in concentration camps. After the war, LGBTQ+ activists reclaimed the symbol, transforming it from a mark of persecution into a symbol of remembrance, resistance and pride.



INTERESTING FACT

Under Nazi persecution, gay men and some other prisoners were forced to wear the pink triangle in concentration camps. Those identified with the symbol often faced brutal treatment, forced labour, and extremely high mortality rates.
